Investment Objective

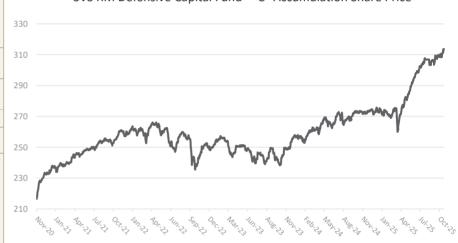
SVS RM Defensive Capital Fund (the "Fund" or "RMDCF") seeks to preserve capital whilst looking for capital growth opportunities over the long term (at least five years) and positive absolute returns in any market conditions over rolling three-year periods.

RM Funds seeks to achieve the investment objective by investing in transferable securities including investment trusts, structured notes, government securities, corporate and convertible bonds, preference shares and other collective investment schemes and exchange traded funds.

Monthly NAV Performance & Dividend

The fund's total return for the month was +2.1% in a positive month for both equity and bond markets. Return over the last 3 years has been +29.2% net of fees.

Portfolio positioning

The portfolio seeks to meet the investment objective by allocating across investments within three segments: Capital Preservation & Income, Capital Growth and Diversifiers.

Capital Preservation & Income: this segment had close to a zero return in the month, with both renewables and REITs having a mixed performance, and both of these assets classes still screen inexpensive in our view.

Capital Growth: Capital Growth had a very strong month, contributing +1.9%, with an increased allocation to this segment early in the month helping performance.

Diversifiers: Diversifiers had close to zero contribution with positive contributions from uranium and Riverstone Energy offset by a loss from miners. We added to our hedging positions. This segment continues to do its job: the fund's monthly correlation with the FTSE100 over the last year still remains close to zero.

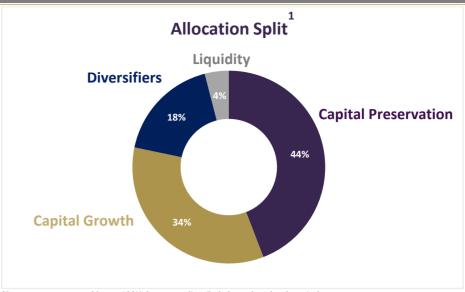

Market Commentary

(Yet) another strong month for equities, with government bonds around flat.

Nvidia and a whole host of other AI-related stocks have had well-documented blockbuster year. We see bubbles in segments like small modular reactors and quantum computing with \$10bn's market cap yet no viable products, let alone revenues. Other sectors have also been dragged into the AI trade: e.g. copper miners (copper prices at all time highs), power producers, air conditioning suppliers etc as investors look for "AI-adjacent" plays. This has made a lot of other (often unlikely) sectors into AI-related plays. US GDP growth is estimated to be 1-2pp higher due to AI. And this in turn will have led credit spreads to tighten, in some areas to record tights. We worry an AI unwind could have much broader consequences than simply a segment of S&P500 stocks selling off. GDP growth could fall from both a big reduction in AI capex and also from lower consumer confidence as stocks fell, with not just AI stocks but also a broader AI-adjacent and a credit sell-off.

The bursting of the tech bubble unwound 3-4 years of (rather extraordinary) equity markets' growth (and it's 3 years since ChatGPT was unveiled). Currently that would take the S&P500 to 4000-4500: -35% vs today. In 2001 bonds fared quite well and acted as a diversifier. But in 2000 the US was running a primary surplus and debt to GDP was below 60% and falling. Bonds might not help this time with US deficits now at around 7%.

Fortunately, or not, growth stocks are not natural holdings for us, but we are also trying to steer the portfolio away from assets that could be caught up in a downturn. We are also still adding to our crash/downside protection hedges.
